The "Solutions That Work" Program is an initiative of the Yukon government and the Rick Hansen Foundation. Its purpose is to provide financial support to Yukon residents with spinal cord or other mobility-related disabilities. These funds are available to assist with the costs of personal and technical supports, accessibility requirements, and community participation. This fund is also available to non-profit organizations and others, including First Nations and municipalities, to assist with similar costs.

This new fund will have \$20,000 available for distribution each year for five years. Individuals may apply for up to \$1,000 per application. Groups and organizations may apply for up to \$2,000 per application.
